## Appendix 1: Pharmacy service specification 2025-26 training requirements

The contractor should ensure that a lead pharmacist has completed the required mandated training which is to:

- Complete, or refresh every 2 years, the CPPE Declaration of Competence for supervision of prescribed medicines at <a href="https://www.cppe.ac.uk/services/declaration-of-competence">https://www.cppe.ac.uk/services/declaration-of-competence</a>.
   Suggested learning could include:
  - CPPE Substance use and misuse e-course (Units 1, 2, 3 and 4) and e-assessment
     (<a href="https://www.cppe.ac.uk/programmes/l/substance-e-02">https://www.cppe.ac.uk/programmes/l/substance-e-02</a>). Note: Low volume pharmacies could consider completing Unit 3 only of this training which focuses on recovery and treatment with non-pharmacological support provided by the wider multidisciplinary team, a detailed look at pharmacological treatments, and supervised consumption of opioid substitute treatments.

The lead pharmacist should be assured that all staff (pharmacists and registered technicians) are competent to deliver the service and will complete the required mandated training which is to:
